There is no enforcing of a permit. There may be a monitoring requirement. That would be the Habitat Branch who issued the permit to make any such recommendations. "HPAC" as per the permit I assume, was Habitat Protection and Compliance branch at the time. That's also a very old file number "99" indicates it was issued in 1999. In addition there should have been permits issued every 5 years, again that's the responsibility of the Habitat Branch. There have likely been thousands of permits issued since 1999 throughout the Lower mainland. As you can image, it would be difficult to monitor all of them. This is why we at the Conservation and Protection Branch encourage the public to report suspected violations. Again, we do not investigate unless a HADD has been confirmed. Also things like riparian setbacks are the responsibility of the Municipality.

I personally have never seen the actual "compensation agreement" that references things like the ponds, green spaces, setbacks and fencing. I have only seen excerpts from other documents referring to it. Again, any such document would have been drafted by our habitat biologists/technicians at the time. We would not have received a copy unless they had also recommended moving forward with prosecution. It would have been an agreement to compensate for lost habitat.

We will monitor West Creek itself, the referenced ponds and the greenspace that was formerly designated as "golf course", as best we can. Again, if there is suspicion of an actual harmful alteration, destruction or disruption of fish habitat, contact our ORR line: 604-607-4186

Your enquiries have been forwarded to our Fish and Fish Habitat Protection Program (FFHPP). They have been responsible for conducting habitat triage to determine and confirm damage to fish habitat. They are responsible for confirming a habitat alteration, disruption or destruction (HADD) as per the Federal Fisheries Act. They are also responsible for permits related to habitat alteration, disruption or destruction (HADD). I assume they are in the process of formulating a response. I apologize on behalf of DFO, if you still have not received a response. I've asked Perry Powers to forward this on the FFHPP again.

We at C&P are the enforcement arm and cannot proceed with an investigation until FFHPP has made the determination of a HADD based on a review and triage of each case. If there has been a determination of "no harm", then C&P closes the occurrence. Occurrences can also be handled by the Province if there are violations of Provincial legislation, such as the Water Act or the Wildlife Act.

I am not aware of which 2021 incident you refer to. The 2017 event under the Fisheries Act habitat prohibitions at the time, determined there was no harm to fish habitat impacting fish species that contribute to commercial, sport or First Nations fisheries.

You have referenced the BC Rancher fines for a file in the BC Interior. In that particular case a HADD was determined to have occurred and the process moved forward from there. There has been no HADD referred to us at C&P in regard to West Creek. All habitat occurrences are routed through FFHPP. As of 2020 the initial triages and on-site visits are now handled by a Habitat Fishery Officer (A Reich) for all occurrences in the Lower BC mainland. This is to determine if an inspection by Fishery Officers and FFHPP biologists is required. FFHPP still is the responsible group in DFO for determining whether or not a HADD has occurred and they recommend what processes might follow if required i.e. restoration order or prosecution.



Hello Matt.

I have reviewed the attached letter which appears to have been drafted by Brad Fanos. It states the following in paragraph four (4) of his letter: "These works involved the relocation of a stormwater pipe and were assessed by C&P officers and FFHPP biologists under the Serious Harm provisions of the Fisheries Act as it existed at the time." Conservation and Protection (C&P) was not involved in the assessment in these complaints. The Fisheries Protection Program (FPP), as it was known under the serious harm years, triaged and made the assessments on habitat complaints so C&P would not have been involved unless FPP determined serious harm had occurred. C&P would then become involved and start an investigation. My point is that a reference to C&P in that paragraph needs to removed as it is not an accurate statement.

C&P did receive incident reports regarding West Creek during the timeframe in question. However, when FPP determined no serious harm occurred C&P closed those reports in our Departmental Violations System (DVS) as there was no offence(s) to follow up on.

Ms. Perrin asks why the West Creek situation is different than the Altherr & Schellenberg Cattle Co. LTD. (A&S). It is different because in the (A&S) case serious harm was determined and at West Creek it was not.

Thank you for your correspondence of March 23, 2023, addressed to the Honourable Joyce Murray, Minister of Fisheries, Oceans and the Canadian Coast Guard, regarding unauthorized works in question near 48th Avenue west of 275th Street in the Township of Langley. I have been asked to respond on the Minister's behalf.

The conservation and protection of Canada's fisheries, oceans and freshwater resources is a top priority for Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO). The Department appreciates your taking the time to contact us with your concerns.

DFO's <u>Fish and Fish Habitat Protection Program (FFHPP)</u> is responsible for reviewing proposed development projects situated in and around fish and fish habitat, while ensuring compliance with relevant provisions of the *Fisheries Act* and the *Species at Risk Act*. DFO's <u>Projects near water website</u> provides information for proponents planning works in or around water that should be reviewed by FFHPP. DFO's Conservation and Protection Program (C&P) is responsible for the receipt, investigation and enforcement response to all reports of damage to fish habitat, death of fish, and deposits of sediment into fish habitat.

In 2017, both FFHPP and C&P received several complaints regarding the works near 48 th Avenue west of 275 th Street. These works involved the relocation of a stormwater pipe and were assessed by C&P officers and FFHPP biologists under the Serious Harm provisions of the *Fisheries Act* as it existed at the time. The site assessments determined that the stormwater pipe still functioned to provide nutrients and flows to downstream fish-bearing habitat within West Creek and that no Serious Harm had occurred. As such, the file was closed.

The <u>modernized Fisheries Act</u> became law in 2019. It introduced new tools to restore protections for fish and fish habitat, rebuild fish populations, enhance marine protection, preserve independent inshore fisheries, and strengthen Indigenous roles in project reviews, monitoring, and policy development. These tools and protections apply to new works and activities, and to existing facilities or structures that may impact fish and fish habitat, such as those barring fish access to watercourses and floodplain habitats.

DFO encourages members of the public who observe what they believe is a violation, including possible impacts to fish or fish habitat, are encouraged to contact DFO's "Observe, Record, Report" (ORR) line, available 24-hours a day, at 1-800-465-4336 or at < DFO.ORR-ONS.MPO@dfo-mpo.gc.ca. >. Reports made to the ORR line are forwarded directly to fishery officers. Even when an immediate response is not possible, these reports assist fishery officers in planning future patrols. Hello Lynn,

As requested, I have forwarded your attached letter to the Community Development Division to be included in the application file. I note you also requested that the letter be forwarded to Council. I

suggest that this would be better served if it was forwarded by yourself with an explanation, so Council can fully understands your concerns. You can email the Mayor and Council directly at mayorcouncil@tol.ca.

Ritchie has forwarded your request for a fee waiver for FOI 23-013 to me. It is my responsibility to review requests for waivers. It is a responsibility I do not take lightly. I do believe in the purpose of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FIPPA) and the importance of transparency, but I also respect that this comes at a cost to all taxpayers of the Township of Langley. When I waive a fee, I am essentially putting the full cost of obtaining the records on the taxpayers of the Township. FIPPA charges allow for minimal cost recovery, and I believe the residents of Langley are entitled to that relief.

In deciding on a waiver, I look at both the request and the time estimated by staff. I believe there is some public interest in this application to some members of the Township, but I am not comfortable waiving the complete fee. Because your request is "all", it was sent to multiple departments to review their records. I suspect what you really are looking for at this time is the development application file. I would like to propose that the fee be waived for the records (including the types you listed) currently included in the development application file for application 14-05-0105. We estimate this will take approximate six to seven hours to produce and I am comfortable waiving four hours of time (the first three hours are at no charge as per FIPPA). Should staff take longer than the estimated time, we will not charge for the extra time. If the file does not provide sufficient information following your review, we can discuss a more focused approach to hopefully provide the correct records.

I am hopeful that this compromise meets with your needs, while respecting the Township's responsibility to the taxpayers.

A Bylaw to amend Langley Official Community Plan Bylaw 1979 No. 1842.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Langley, in Open Meeting Assembled, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as "Langley Official Community Plan Bylaw 1979 No. 1842 Amendment (Streamside Protection and Enhancement Clarification) Bylaw No. 5854".
- The "Langley Official Community Plan Bylaw 1979 No. 1842" Schedule 3
 Development Permit Areas: Streamside Protection and Enhancement, as amended, is further amended by:
 - a. Replacing the definition of "Stream" in Section 3 of Schedule 3 with the following: "Stream" means:
 - a natural watercourse, including a natural glacier course, or a natural body of water, whether the stream channel of the stream has been modified, or
 - a natural source of water supply, including, without limitation, a lake, pond, river, creek, spring, ravine, gulch, wetland or glacier, whether or not usually containing water, including ice, but does not include an aguifer;
 - b. Adding the following definitions to Section 3 of Schedule 3 in alphabetical order:
 - a. "Fisheries Act" means the Fisheries Act, RSC 1985, c. F-14 as amended or re-enacted from time to time;
 - b. "Riparian Areas Protection Regulation" means the Riparian Areas Protection Regulation, BC Reg 178/2019 as amended or re-enacted from time to time;
 - "Fish habitat" means water frequented by fish and any other areas on which fish depend directly or indirectly to carry out their life processes, including spawning grounds and nursery, rearing, food supply and migration areas;
 - d. "Water Sustainability Act" means the Water Sustainability Act, SBC 2014, c 15 as amended or re-enacted from time to time;
 - e. "Watercourse" means any natural or human-made body of water that may or may not provide fish habitat that fall under two categories:
 - regulated watercourse, does not include a Class C watercourse, and includes:
 - a. known or suspected fish-bearing watercourses, including watercourses classified as Class A, Class A(OD), Class A(OW) and Class B as shown on Map 11 "Watercourse Classification Map", and natural watercourses or natural water supply sources, and
 - watercourses that do not in fact provide fish habitat, but may include natural watercourses or watercourses

containing a natural source of water supply, including watercourses classified as Class C as shown on Map 11; and,

- Non-Regulated Class C watercourse includes watercourses that do not in fact provide fish habitat, are not natural watercourses, and do not contain a natural source of water supply.
- c. Replacing Section 4.16.2 of Schedule 3 with the following:
 - a. "The proposed development is completely outside of the designated Streamside Protection and Enhancement Development Permit Area and where it can be demonstrated to the acceptance of the Township in accordance with section 5 that the proposed development will not result in negative impacts to the watercourse;"
- d. Replacing Section 4.22 of Schedule 3 with the following:
 - a. Where a proponent contends that a watercourse location depicted on Map 11 is in error, the proponent can submit for consideration by the Township a report prepared by a B.C. Land Survey Professional that identifies the location of the watercourse.
- Inserting the following as a new Section 4.23 of Schedule 3 and renumbering the following section accordingly:
 - a. Where a proponent contends that a watercourse classification depicted on Map 11 is in error, the proponent can submit for consideration by the Township either an:
 - assessment prepared by a qualified professional in accordance with section 5, where it is contended that a watercourse is a nonregulated Class C watercourse; or
 - A report prepared by a qualified professional that provides a classification of the watercourse, as applicable.
- f. Adding the following as a new Section 4.25 of Schedule 3:
 - Despite this Bylaw, development may be located within the Streamside Protection and Enhancement Development Permit Area if:
 - the site is subject to undue hardship and meets the riparian protection standard for sites subject to undue hardship in accordance with the Riparian Areas Protection Regulation;
 - ii. the qualified professional determines the proposed development will not result in any harmful alteration, disruption or destruction of fish habitat;
 - iii. provincial approval for changes in and about a stream has been obtained under the Water Sustainability Act, or
 - iv. federal authorization for development that results in the harmful alteration, disruption or destruction of fish habitat has been obtained under the Fisheries Act.
- g. Inserting the following as a new Section 5: Development Adjacent to Regulated Watercourses and renumbering the following section accordingly:
 - 5. Development Adjacent to Regulated Watercourses
 - 5.1 If development is to be located outside of the Streamside Protection and Enhancement Development Permit Area and a qualified professional determines the proposed development will not:
 - a. result in any harm to fish habitat;

- b. impact the flow of a natural water source; or
- result in any impacts or modifications to a natural watercourse;

the development may proceed without requiring the government approvals or authorizations that may be engaged under the Streamside Protection and Enhancement Development Permit Area, the Water Sustainability Act, the Riparian Areas Protection Regulation, or the Fisheries Act.

Non-Regulated Class C Watercourse Assessments

- 5.2 Where an owner of an affected parcel contends a watercourse is a Non-Regulated Class C watercourse, the owner must engage a qualified professional to assess the watercourse to determine whether it is a Non-Regulated Class C watercourse.
- 5.3 The owner must file the original completed qualified professional assessment referred to in Section 5.2 to the Township for review.
- 5.4 The assessment must include both field components and desktop analysis to adequately describe current and historical modifications to the watercourse.
- 5.5 To classify the water body as a Class C watercourse, the qualified professional must in the assessment confirm the following conditions regarding the watercourse:
 - a. the watercourse does not represent a natural watercourse, whether or not the stream channel has been modified, including but not limited to a lake, pond, river, creek, spring, ravine, gulch, wetland or glacier, as defined by the Water Sustainability Act:
 - the watercourse does not contain a natural source of water supply, as defined by the Water Sustainability Act; and
 - c. the watercourse does not connect to or provide water frequented by fish or other areas on which fish depend on either directly or indirectly to carry out their life processes, as defined by the Riparian Areas Protection Regulation and the Fisheries Act.
- 5.6 The watercourse may only be classified as a Non-Regulated Class C watercourse if all three conditions are satisfied. If any of the conditions are not discounted in the assessment, the waterbody must be treated as a regulated watercourse.
- 5.7 The classification of the watercourse by the qualified professional shall be binding upon the Township.

Development Adjacent to Non-Regulated Class C Watercourses
5.8 If a waterbody is classified as a Non-Regulated Class C watercourse, then the proposed development may proceed without requiring the

The Township's watercourse classification system was developed consistent with objectives of the RAPR to protect fish and fish habitat. The Water Sustainability Act pertains to and protects water. Proposed Bylaw No. 5854 OCP Schedule 3 amendments are designed to clarify outcomes with regards to regulatory requirements and includes:

- Update of legislative references; and
- QEP determination of a non-regulated Class C watercourse those which do not engage
 any of the watercourse approval processes under the legislations in accordance with its
 distinct regulated terms. If this determination is made then there is no further
 engagement of any watercourse approval processes (Township, Provincial, Federal).

The proposed amendment continues to rely on a proponent to retain a QEP to review the site and conduct appropriate assessments to determine the regulatory requirements.

Official Community Plan Consultation Policy:

As the proposed amendments to Schedule 3 of the OCP are limited to clarification items to improve implementation, staff recommend that Council consider the proposed OCP amendment consistent with the Township's OCP Consultation Policy, financial plans (both operating and capital), Metro Vancouver's Waste Management Plans, and the Housing Needs Report.

Policy Considerations:

The proposed bylaw amendments clarify the outcomes with regards to regulatory requirements and the classification of watercourses while maintaining the certainty to landowners and developers of SPEA requirements and an efficient administrative framework.

- placement of rock structures (riprap wall and rock groynes) at or within the Klinaklini River mainstem;
- unauthorized works and habitat destruction and clearing on Crown land; and,
- unauthorized diversion structure and sprinkler system on Crown land.

In 2017 unauthorized works - 100 meters of West Creek under 48th Avenue west of 275 Street took place when Township of Langley knew the permits had expired in 2015 according to the recent TOL report presented to TOL Council Mar. 13, 2023.

Thank you for your correspondence of March 23, 2023, addressed to the Honourable Joyce Murray, Minister of Fisheries, Oceans and the Canadian Coast Guard, regarding concerns about unauthorized works near 48th Avenue west of 275th Street in the Township of Langley. I have been asked to respond on the Minister's behalf.

The conservation and protection of Canada's fisheries, oceans, and freshwater resources is a top priority for Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO). The Department appreciates your efforts to contact us with your concerns.

DFO's Fish and Fish Habitat Protection Program (FFHPP) is responsible for reviewing proposed development projects situated in and around fish and fish habitat, while ensuring compliance with relevant provisions of the Fisheries Act and the Species at Risk Act. The Department's projects near water webpage provides information for proponents planning works in or around water that should be reviewed by FFHPP. DFO's Conservation and Protection Program (C&P) is responsible for the receipt, investigation, and enforcement response to reports of damage to fish habitat, death of fish, and deposits of sediment into fish habitat.

In 2017, the Department received several complaints regarding the works near 48th Avenue west of 275th Street. These works involved the relocation of a stormwater pipe and were assessed by FFHPP biologists under the serious harm provisions of the *Fisheries Act* as it existed at the time. The site assessments determined that the stormwater pipe still functioned to provide nutrients and flows to downstream, fish-bearing habitat within West Creek and that no serious harm had occurred. As such, the file was closed.

In the Altherr & Schellenberg Cattle Co. Ltd. case that you refer to in your letter, serious harm was determined to have occurred. As such, a C&P investigation was launched and the company was ultimately charged, and convicted, under the *Fisheries Act*.

The <u>modernized Fisheries Act</u> became law in 2019. It introduced new tools to restore protections for fish and fish habitat, rebuild fish populations, enhance marine protection, preserve independent inshore fisheries, and strengthen Indigenous roles in project reviews, monitoring, and policy development. These tools and protections apply to new works and activities, and to existing facilities or structures that may impact fish and fish habitat, such as those barring fish access to watercourses and floodplain habitats.

DFO encourages members of the public who observe what they believe is a violation, including possible impacts to fish or fish habitat, to contact DFO's "Observe, Record, Report" (ORR) line, available 24-hours a day, at 1-800-465-4336, or at < <u>DFO.ORR-ONS.MPO@dfo-mpo.gc.ca</u> >. Reports made to the ORR line are forwarded directly to fishery officers. Even when an immediate response is not warranted or possible, these reports assist fishery officers in planning future patrols. We have known since inception 20 years or so ago that the professional reliance model is not working to protect habitat.

My questions would be ...

- 1) whether the highlighted clauses that appear to give consultants too much discretion, are new or not.
 - a. Why are these new clauses necessary, and now. It would be awesome with each new proposed by-law amendments in general, that ToL staff provide an overview executive summary (1 page), that explains why these changes are being proposed and now. Is this document perhaps available but we're just not seeing it?
 - b. Furthermore, are we to just hang our hat on any one Consultant Firm that submits their assessment, and without any further peer review? I thought that was the ToL's job to do a Peer Review? Shouldn't we be offered a means still for a second opinion? If I were diagnosed 'terminally ill', I would for sure expect to get a 2nd or

even 3rd opinion, and I strongly believe the health of our streams and watersheds are equally important as our individual health. I think we're all concerned here, of the picking away of proper due diligence and erosion of proper checks and balances. This links to 1a above. What's the 'intention' here.

- 2) what is happening with other municipalities or whether TOL is pushing things further in developer's favour. This is also a great question. This Monday, there is a round table meeting at the Stoney Creek Env Committee meeting room in Burnaby. I've attended this for almost every year the past 10 years, and there are definitely more organized Stream Steward Groups that have volunteer Members that I would call more "expert" at this sort of By-Law stuff but for the benefit of the salmon and streams. I'm thinking of bringing this along to that meeting to get some feedback. I may send a heads up this evening to a few key members. (I've attached the meeting invite to the Stoney Creek Round Table Meeting this Monday, March 6th at 7pm does anyone wish to attend?)
- 3) 3) how this compares with what the province is doing. Not just the Province, but what about the DFO? Where's their position on this? Absolutely neutral? Is the Federal Fisheries Act being compromised or circumvented here in any way?

In closing, I see a new ToL Mayor & Council pushing ahead with their agenda, and zero public outreach beforehand and informally with our teams. This has me worried and sends up a few red flags. Why not call a group of us in for a coffee and biscuits and have a chat about this first? Or are we all that insignificant?

Thank you for your correspondence of March 23, 2023, addressed to the Honourable Joyce Murray, Minister of Fisheries, Oceans and the Canadian Coast Guard, regarding unauthorized works in question near 48th Avenue west of 275 Street in the Township of Langley. I have been asked to respond on the Minister's behalf.

The conservation and protection of Canada's fisheries, oceans and freshwater resources is a top priority for Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO). The Department appreciates your taking the time to contact us with your concerns.

DFO's <u>Fish and Fish Habitat Protection Program (FFHPP)</u> is responsible for reviewing proposed development projects situated in and around fish and fish habitat, while ensuring compliance with relevant provisions of the *Fisheries Act* and the *Species at Risk Act*. DFO's <u>Projects near water website</u> provides information for proponents planning works in or around water that should be reviewed by FFHPP. DFO's Conservation and Protection Program (C&P) is responsible for the receipt, investigation and enforcement response to all reports of damage to fish habitat, death of fish, and deposits of sediment into fish habitat.

In 2017, both FFHPP and C&P received several complaints regarding the unauthorized works near 48th Avenue west of 275 Street. These works involved the relocation of a stormwater pipe and were assessed by C&P officers and FFHPP biologists under the Serious Harm provisions of the *Fisheries Act* as it existed at the time. The site assessments determined that the stormwater pipe still functioned to provide nutrients and flows to downstream fish-bearing habitat within West Creek and that no Serious Harm had occurred. As such, the file was closed.

The <u>modernized Fisheries Act</u> became law in 2019. It introduced new tools to restore protections for fish and fish habitat, rebuild fish populations, enhance marine protection, preserve independent inshore fisheries, and strengthen Indigenous roles in project reviews, monitoring, and policy development. These tools and protections apply to new works and activities, and to existing facilities or structures that may impact fish and fish habitat, such as those barring fish access to watercourses and floodplain habitats.

DFO encourages members of the public who observe what they believe is a violation, including possible impacts to fish or fish habitat, are encouraged to contact DFO's "Observe, Record, Report" (ORR) line, available 24-hours a day, at 1-800-465-4336 or at < <u>DFO.ORR-ONS.MPO@dfo-mpo.gc.ca</u>. >. Reports made to the ORR line are forwarded immediately to fishery officers. Even when an immediate response is not possible, these reports assist fishery officers in planning future patrols. More information is available on DFO's <u>Report a fisheries violation</u> webpage.

This key modernization will allow scientists, citizen scientists and concerned community members to better track cumulative impacts on fish habitat. A review of the Act every five years is another much needed transparency mechanism.....

West Coast notes that increased inspection and enforcement for fisheries offences must occur, particularly given the dramatic drop in enforcement following the 2012 amendments. Under the

current *Fisheries Act*, there were zero prosecutions for fish habitat damage between 2012 and 2016."

In the case of industrial infrastructure activities in and about West Creek 2018 to 2023 it appears that DFO is NOT enforcing the 2018 amendments to the Fisheries Act. The 5th year review is definitely needed.

Re: Construction in the Riparian Area at 5016 – 272nd Street, Langley, B.C.

As discussed on March 4th, the construction work that is being completed on the property operated by EV Logistics at 5016 – 272nd Street in Langley, BC (the Subject Site) appears to be in contravention of several environmental regulations and without the necessary government permits and approvals; therefore, further work on the site should not proceed until the project can be brought into compliance. I am reaching out to you as the point of contact for this project, but would appreciate it if this letter could be forwarded by you to the Professional Engineer of Record for this work, and any RPBio who is providing services on this project, since they would ultimately be responsible for ensuring that regulatory requirements are met.

The purpose of this letter is to request a written response from EV Logistics, or the owner of the property (Jim Patterson Development Ltd.), indicating how development on the site will comply with provincially mandated Riparian Area setbacks and the restrictive covenant on the property. The DFO Authorization for the Property (# 99-HPAC-PA2-000-000217) expired in 2015, and can no longer be used as the basis for obtaining a building permit for this project or working within the riparian area.

By way of introduction, I am an Environmental Engineer who has been practicing in BC for over 30 years, and have experience related to environmental impact assessments and protection plans for construction projects, environmental monitoring, riparian area protection, and permitting through all levels of government in the province. I'm also the recipient of the Fellow of Engineers Canada award for outstanding contributions to the practice of engineering, and I'm concerned about the negative environmental impacts of the work being performed on the site.



Photo 1, below, shows the Subject Site, and the location of West Creek (thin red and yellow lines), a 15-metre creek setback (bold yellow line), and the restrictive covenant area that encloses a wetland connected to the creek (orange line).

Photos 2 and 3, below, show that removal of vegetation, grubbing, stockpiling of soil, and placement of crushed rock have occurred immediately adjacent to West Creek, a salmonbearing waterbody, and one of the "Sensitive Streams" listed in the province's *Water Sustainability Regulation*, BC Reg 187/2020. As such, these construction activities all appear to have taken place within the riparian area of West Creek, as defined by British Columbia's *Riparian Areas Protection Regulation*, BC Reg 178/2019. In addition, the Ultimate Drainage drawing #467-02-12 (attached) prepared by envirowest Environmental Consultants, and submitted in 2000 to the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) as part of a permit application, shows a restrictive covenant boundary of 30 metres from the top of the creek bank for industrial or commercial development, and 15 metres for residential. The Township of Langley's (Township's) *Sustainability Charter* also requires the protection and enhancement of streams, wildlife habitats and environmentally sensitive areas, all of which describe West Creek.

The watercourse through this property has been designated Class "B", as shown on the Township's drawing entitled *Watercourse Classification - Version 4.0*, dated December 2016 (attached), which was created in collaboration with the DFO, BC's Ministry of Forests, Lands, and Natural Resource Operation, and the Langley Environmental Partners Society. Class "B" refers to waterbodies that are a "significant source of food, nutrient or cool water supplies to downstream fish populations". The DFO has also stated in a letter (attached) that, "The West Creek watershed has historically been a productive coho, chinook, and chum salmon system, along with supporting cutthroat trout and steelhead populations and other finfish. Currently, juvenile and adult coho salmon are sighted in the area annually ... These coho are a natural (wild) stock, and natural salmon stocks from the many smaller streams and their tributaries in coastal BC are important contributors to the genetic diversity and overall wellbeing of salmon in BC. Therefore, West Creek, its headwaters, and its tributaries should be protected as much as possible in order to continue to provide suitable spawning and rearing habitat for salmon, and also be protected to help maintain all the other diversity of life that utilizes the watershed."

Jimmy Pattison, the CEO and Chairman of Jim Pattison Group, has stated that the environment is the "number one issue" for the company (https://www.bnnbloomberg.ca/billionaire-pattison-sees-environment-as-number-one-issue-for-his-business-empire-1.1353116). The Subject Site is owned by Jim Patterson Development Ltd., and another company in the Group, Canadian Fishing Company (Canfisco), requires that fish habitat be protected, in order to sustain its future operations. As such, I'm sure that EV Logistics wishes to comply with all necessary government regulations, and create a project that is environmentally friendly. This is especially important on the Subject Site, since work near West Creek has the potential to negatively impact a Sensitive Stream with high fisheries value.

Work within the provincially mandated riparian setbacks can have significant deleterious effects on a watercourse's ability to sustain fish and other wildlife. Given Jim Pattison Group's focus on the environment, the increasing threats of climate change and habitat destruction on the survival of species at risk in Canada, including salmon populations, I encourage EV Logistics to take this opportunity to diligently assess the environmental implications of this project before proceeding further. There are several options for protecting West Creek during construction including:

- Replanting native vegetation throughout the riparian area;
- Ensuring that the building footprint is located entirely outside of the mandated riparian area setbacks, by decreasing the size of the building, if necessary;
- Installing bio-swales to collect and treat parking lot and roof runoff; and
- Funding and implementing a stream daylighting project to restore fish passage through
 West Creek in the vicinity of your site, in order to allow fish to migrate upstream, as they
 did prior to the creation of Gloucester Estates. This could be part of a relatively low-cost
 community project, and highlighted in the Jim Pattison Group or Canfisco sustainability
 report to showcase the company's commitment to environmental stewardship.



I look forward to hearing back from you at your earliest convenience, and learning how EV Logistics will be implementing this project in an eco-friendly manner in keeping with the values of the Jim Pattison Group.





Specifically, Tsilhqot'in Nation spokesperson Scott Thompson told Glacier Media A&S entered pleas to four amended "rolled-up" counts under the federal Fisheries Act and the provincial Forest and Range Practices Act and the Water Sustainability Act, for various unauthorized works on both private and Crown land at or near the Kleena Kleene river, between 2019 and 2021.

Those charges are:

- riparian and instream habitat destruction, including riparian clearing and infilling of side channels and tributary habitat;
- placement of rock structures (riprap wall and rock groynes) at or within the Klinaklini River mainstem;
- unauthorized works and habitat destruction and clearing on Crown land; and.
- unauthorized diversion structure and sprinkler system on Crown land.

In 2017 unauthorized works - 100 meters of West Creek under 48th Avenue west of 275 Street took place when Township of Langley knew the permits had expired in 2015 according to the recent TOL report presented to TOL Council Mar. 13, 2023.

No charges have ever been made against the Township of Langley in spite 9f complaints made to DFO and BC MELP. . Why is this different than the Altherr & Schellenberg Cattle Co case?





West Coast notes that increased inspection and enforcement for fisheries offences must occur, particularly given the dramatic drop in enforcement following the 2012 amendments. Under the current *Fisheries Act*, there were zero prosecutions for fish habitat damage between 2012 and 2016."

In the case of industrial infrastructure activities in and about West Creek 2018 to 2023 it appears that DFO is NOT enforcing the 2018 amendments to the Fisheries Act. The 5th year review is definitely needed.







Thank you for your correspondence of March 23, 2023, addressed to the Honourable Joyce Murray, Minister of Fisheries, Oceans and the Canadian Coast Guard, regarding concerns about unauthorized works near 48th Avenue west of 275th Street in the Township of Langley. I have been asked to respond on the Minister's behalf.

The conservation and protection of Canada's fisheries, oceans, and freshwater resources is a top priority for Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO). The Department appreciates your efforts to contact us with your concerns.

DFO's Fish and Fish Habitat Protection Program (FFHPP) is responsible for reviewing proposed development projects situated in and around fish and fish habitat, while ensuring compliance with relevant provisions of the Fisheries Act and the Species at Risk Act. The Department's projects near water webpage provides information for proponents planning works in or around water that should be reviewed by FFHPP. DFO's Conservation and Protection Program (C&P) is responsible for the receipt, investigation, and enforcement response to reports of damage to fish habitat, death of fish, and deposits of sediment into fish habitat.

In 2017, the Department received several complaints regarding the works near 48th Avenue west of 275th Street. These works involved the relocation of a stormwater pipe and were assessed by FFHPP biologists under the serious harm provisions of the *Fisheries Act* as it existed at the time. The site assessments determined that the stormwater pipe still functioned to provide nutrients and flows to downstream, fish-bearing habitat within West Creek and that no serious harm had occurred. As such, the file was closed.

In the Altherr & Schellenberg Cattle Co. Ltd. case that you refer to in your letter, serious harm was determined to have occurred. As such, a C&P investigation was launched and the company was ultimately charged, and convicted, under the *Fisheries Act*.





Thank you for your correspondence of March 23, 2023, addressed to the Honourable Joyce Murray, Minister of Fisheries, Oceans and the Canadian Coast Guard, regarding concerns about unauthorized works near 48th Avenue west of 275th Street in the Township of Langley. I have been asked to respond on the Minister's behalf.

The conservation and protection of Canada's fisheries, oceans, and freshwater resources is a top priority for Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO). The Department appreciates your efforts to contact us with your concerns.

DFO's Fish and Fish Habitat Protection Program (FFHPP) is responsible for reviewing proposed development projects situated in and around fish and fish habitat, while ensuring compliance with relevant provisions of the Fisheries Act and the Species at Risk Act. The Department's projects near water webpage provides information for proponents planning works in or around water that should be reviewed by FFHPP. DFO's Conservation and Protection Program (C&P) is responsible for the receipt, investigation, and enforcement response to reports of damage to fish habitat, death of fish, and deposits of sediment into fish habitat.

In 2017, the Department received several complaints regarding the works near 48th Avenue west of 275th Street. These works involved the relocation of a stormwater pipe and were assessed by FFHPP biologists under the serious harm provisions of the *Fisheries Act* as it existed at the time. The site assessments determined that the stormwater pipe still functioned to provide nutrients and flows to downstream, fish-bearing habitat within West Creek and that no serious harm had occurred. As such, the file was closed.

In the Altherr & Schellenberg Cattle Co. Ltd. case that you refer to in your letter, serious harm was determined to have occurred. As such, a C&P investigation was launched and the company was ultimately charged, and convicted, under the *Fisheries Act*.

The <u>modernized Fisheries Act</u> became law in 2019. It introduced new tools to restore protections for fish and fish habitat, rebuild fish populations, enhance marine protection, preserve independent inshore fisheries, and strengthen Indigenous roles in project reviews, monitoring, and policy development. These tools and protections apply to new works and activities, and to existing facilities or structures that may impact fish and fish habitat, such as those barring fish access to watercourses and floodplain habitats.

DFO encourages members of the public who observe what they believe is a violation, including possible impacts to fish or fish habitat, to contact DFO's "Observe, Record, Report" (ORR) line, available 24-hours a day, at 1-800-465-4336, or at < <u>DFO.ORR-ONS.MPO@dfo-mpo.gc.ca</u> >. Reports made to the ORR line are forwarded directly to fishery officers. Even when an immediate response is not warranted or possible, these reports assist fishery officers in planning future patrols.
